**PLANNING, PARKS & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:** Planner Brubaker gave an update on the City and the planning work and visioning and park planning in that neighborhood. We have been working on the Kootenai Cut-off Road a lot over the years. We are going to have expenses there in terms of upgrading the road to keep up with growth. In 2012-13 we conducted a City center and strategic plan.

Ponderay Dog Park Project Presentation. Panhandle Animal Shelter Concept Design and Fundraising Plan. Mandy Evans-Panhandle Animal Shelter: This property is owned by the Shelter, someday they may want to do something else with it and this park will allow the land to be productive and still be available for development in the future. The community has been begging for an off leash dog park. Our priority aligns with the Cities priorities. Mayor Geiger wrote a letter of support for us for a grant that we did receive. Pet Safe grant was for twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) Rotary, Laughing Dog and other Ponderay Businesses are interest in helping establish this dog park. We have over twenty businesses that are willing to do in kind donations of labor or product or discounted donations to support the park. Our commitment is, we have dedicated hours into the planning, writing the grant, we are doing fundraisers. We will build the park using the donated funds. The value of that park right now is one hundred sixty thousand dollars (\$160,000.00) We will allow public access to our bathrooms, use of our parking, we will cover the cost of the security lighting in the park. We would like to partner with Ponderay to host events and activities in the park to bring people in. What we would like for Ponderay is we would lease the park to you so you can put the park on your insurance. She introduced Steve Nybank who is the project manager. We have created the park to be as maintenance as possible. The ground cover will be a pea gravel which helps with drainage. The park would require garbage pickup and some snow removal. It is twenty eight thousand four hundred sq. ft. (28,400 sq ft) a fenced in space that is ADA compliant. There is a small and big dog yard. The entrance and exits are all catch pens. The safety lighting will be a low setting and if somebody shows up it would go on higher but it can go off at night. This would also allow the police, if they did see the lights on, they would be alerted to go check it out. There will be a walking path around the park that would connect the back of the park to Kootenai Cut-off Road and the new pathway. We are keeping part of the berm from the storage unit that we are currently working on, so that there is a buffer between the dogs at the shelter and the ones in the park. Steve Nybank showed us his concepts. There was conversation.
