

How will the City fund it?

- If approved by voters on Nov. 5, the city would add a 1 percent temporary sales tax to all sales made in Ponderay less than \$1,000.
- The tax would automatically expire after 5 years.
- A 1 percent sales tax would add 10 cents to a \$10 item, 50 cents to a \$50 purchase, \$5 to a \$500 purchase, and so on.
- All of the 1 percent sales tax revenues would stay in the city for the above projects.

Why is it needed?

- The city does not have adequate funds for recreation projects. While Ponderay is a regional shopping hub, the city's share of state sales tax is only \$115,000 per year due to its small population and relatively low taxable property value.



Current crossing locations are not safe or legal.

How do I vote?

- If you are already a registered voter, just visit your designated polling location on Nov. 5, or get an absentee ballot to vote early. Voting information is available at Idahovotes.gov.
